Of course this is to be concreted in a position beside the footpath very soon.

AND Thanks to the kind help and support of the boys at Keyosk in Rimu Steet, Paraparaumu, we even have an amazing, laser engraved plaque to fit into the back of the seat telling everyone where this seat came from with an image of MenzShed Kapiti workshops in action behind the wording.

Richard and George have made major progress is preparing a large number of old rimu balustrade pieces and gluing them into a block ready to cut into chopping blocks. Those will be beautiful pieces that can be sold at a market.

Bill has completed an extra workbench for our workshop. Before he's had time to urethane the top surface its already been borrowed for a kitchen unit to be assembled for a lady.

Anton has completed a prototype stool like we all used to have at home.

## PLUS - PREPARING KITS FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD TEACHERS TO ASSEMBLE

On Friday 1 November we have agreed to help out with activities for a bunch of early childhood teachers having a special development day. We need to prepare kits of recycled materials that can be assembled into items of use at early childhood centres. Things like planter boxes using old plastic water toby boxes or small childrens picnic tables. We have some designs but now we need to get things ready.

**VERY SOON - KCDC IMPLEMENT SHED DISMANTLING** - Now that the fence is finished our next big challenge is to dismantle the old KCDC implement shed from an adjacent property. Then as soon as we have the consents signed off we need to reassemble the building alongside our present workshops for space for ourselves and others. Plans are done and consent applications have all been lodged with Council along with all the necessary safety plans etc. We should get the go ahead any day now. When that happens we need to have the building gone by the end of the month. So get into training ready. We should have Ross all lined up to make extensive cups of tea and coffee to keep us charged while we get the job done. So it will be YO HEAVE HO! Maybe you can crack a whip to help get things done.

**THEN ALSO VERY SOON - COVERED VERANDAH FOR WORKSHOP** - The Waikanae Community Board has granted us money toward the concrete for our covered verandah area in front of the 3 bay workshop. We need to prepare the boxing and we are short of a few large beams for the roof so if you know of any it would be much appreciated. But apart from that we need your body to get along and help or just rev up the ones who can do the job through encouragement or abuse or whatever it takes.

Well that's about the news for now. There's always lots happening at the shed; drinking coffee and tea; sorting donated bits and pieces; laying out the workshops; projects to benefit the community; creating a MenzShed Kapiti website; organising the New Zealand MenzShed Conference for March 2014.
