The caravan was donated to Kapiti Island by the National Provident Fund in 1980 for work on Little Spotted Kiwi. DOC rangers used it extensively for research & pest eradication. When it was "retired" in 2015 it flew to Whareroa. Kapiti Menzshed restored it, Guardians prepared site & artist Julie Oliver is painting the mural (as weather permits).
